Topic: Means of transport – vocabulary. Introduction to vocabulary.

Level: A1+

## LEARNING OBJECTIVES - GENERAL REQUIREMENTS (CORE CURRICULUM):

- Understanding oral and written statements on the topic of "Means of Transport."
- Using basic vocabulary related to means of transport.
- Responding to simple commands and questions about means of transport.
- Developing teamwork skills.

# **Key competencies**

- 1. Competencies in the field of understanding and creating information:
- Understanding oral and written statements: Students will work with verbal riddles, pictures, interactive exercises and teacher questions, which develops their ability to understand information in English.
- Using vocabulary: The lesson focuses on introducing and consolidating vocabulary related to means of transport, which is crucial for communication in a foreign language.
- 2. Multilingual competencies:
- Students learn and use vocabulary from a foreign language in the field of means of transport.
- Students learn to distinguish and use the prepositions "in" and "on" in the context of means of transport.
- 3. Digital competencies:
- Students will use an interactive whiteboard/projector and computers/tablets to perform interactive exercises, which develops their digital skills.
- Students will use online educational platforms such as LearningApps, Wordwall and Liveworksheets.
- 4. Personal, social and learning competencies:

- Teamwork: Working in pairs and groups during exercises and language games promotes the development of teamwork skills.
- Self-assessment: Interactive exercises with immediate answer checking and an evaluation survey allow students to assess their own progress.
- Active participation: Solving riddles, repeating vocabulary, answering questions and participating in language games requires active participation in the lesson.

## 5. Communication competencies:

- Verbal communication: Students will communicate with the teacher and other students, using English to name and describe means of transport.
- Responding to commands and questions: Students will respond to simple commands and questions about means of transport, which develops their ability to communicate in a foreign language.

# CONTENT - DETAILED REQUIREMENTS (CORE CURRICULUM):

- The student knows and uses basic vocabulary related to means of transport (e.g., car, bus, train, plane, bicycle).
- The student can name and describe basic means of transport.
- The student can understand and answer simple questions about means of transport.

### METHODS OF WORK:

- Communicative method.
- Visual method.
- Pair and group work.
- Language games and activities.

### **TEACHING AIDS:**

- English Class A1+ textbook.
- Picture cards with means of transport.
- Interactive whiteboard/projector.
- English Class A1+ workbook.
- Computer with internet access.
- Materials for interactive exercises.

#### **ANTICIPATED TIME: 45 minutes**

### LESSON PLAN:

- 1. Warm-up (5 minutes)
- Objective: To arouse interest in the topic, activate students.
- Teacher's information/instructions: Prepare several verbal or visual riddles related to means of transport.
- Student's information/instructions: Actively participate in solving the riddles.

- Teaching situations:
  - The teacher presents riddles, e.g., "I have wheels and an engine. I can carry many people. What am I?" (Bus).
  - o Students guess the answers.
  - The teacher can show pictures of vehicles and ask them to be named in English.
- Graphic materials/attachments: Picture cards with means of transport.
- 2. Vocabulary Presentation (15 minutes)
- Objective: Introduction and consolidation of new vocabulary students write new vocabulary in notebooks.
- Teacher's information/instructions: Use the textbook, picture cards, and interactive whiteboard.
- Student's information/instructions: Repeat words, do exercises from the textbook.
- Complete exercise number 2 from the textbook on page 95.
- Students write down the vocabulary from exercise 5 on page 95 in the textbook.
- Teaching situations:
  - o The teacher presents new words using pictures and pronunciation.
  - o Students repeat the words in chorus and individually.
  - o Exercises from the textbook (e.g., matching pictures to words).
  - The teacher provides a brief explanation of the differences between "on" and "in" in the context of traveling by vehicles.
- Graphic materials/attachments: Exercises from the textbook, interactive whiteboard.
- 3. Interactive Exercises (15 minutes)
- Objective: Vocabulary consolidation, self-assessment.
- Teacher's information/instructions: Prepare interactive exercises, monitor student progress.
- Student's information/instructions: Do the exercises, check the answers.
- Teaching situations:
  - o Students do interactive exercises on computers or tablets.
  - o The teacher provides individual assistance.
  - Students have the option to immediately check the correctness of their answers.
- Graphic materials/attachments: Interactive exercises (links below).
- 4. Summary and Evaluation (10 minutes)
- Objective: Review key words, assess the degree of understanding of the material.
- Teacher's information/instructions: Conduct a short round of questions and answers, gather feedback.
- Student's information/instructions: Answer questions, express your opinions.
- Teaching situations:
  - o The teacher asks questions like: "What is this?" (showing a picture), "How do you travel to school?".
  - o Students answer.
  - A short evaluation survey (e.g., "What was the easiest/most difficult for you?").

Tips for working with people with diverse developmental needs:

- Use visualizations and pictures.
- Adjust the pace of work to the students' abilities.
- Provide additional support for students with difficulties.
- For students with concentration difficulties, additional movement tasks or short breaks can be introduced.

### LESSON EVALUATION:

- Observation of student activity during the lesson.
- Checking the results of interactive exercises.
- Analysis of student answers to summary questions.
- Evaluation survey.
